


40 is the new **50**

- Towards Zero 2016/2020 Victoria Road Safety Strategy & Action Plan
- Partnering LGAs & State Gov't engage local communities on the need for Safer Speeds on local streets – Safe Systems philosophy
- Maribyrnong starts prep work in late 2017 (program endorsed by Council)
- Encouraging more to walk or ride
- Lower speed limit needed to support this vision
- Default urban speed limit = 50
- Traffic calming measures will also slow down vehicles in local streets
- Must be credible





Risk of death vs vehicle impact speed



Risk of pedestrian death as a function of vehicle impact speed

This illustrates that the risk of pedestrian death rises exponentially with collision speeds beyond 30 km/h. It is estimated that less than 10% of pedestrians would die when struck by a vehicle travelling at 30 km/h, compared with fatality rates of around 25% at 40 km/h and over 80% at 50 km/h.






Area 2 – speed limit reduction

 were also reduced from
 60 to 50 km/hr in
 July/August 2019.







Road Safety Strategy & Action Plan

- Holistic and supports Safe Systems principles
 - Safer Roads
 - Safer Speeds
 - Safer People
 - Safer Vehicles
- Focus on Action Plan for next 10 years
 - Advocacy on main arterial roads, public transport stops, trucks, congestion and pollution
 - Collaboration with external stakeholders and road safety partners eg DoT, VicPol, ARRB to achieve more outcomes than we could in isolation
 - Support active transport (walking and cycling) for a healthy and sustainable community and consideration of their vulnerability (Bicycle Strategy 2020-2030)
 - Lowering the speed limits on Council-owned roads and implementing new traffic calming measures such as road surface changes or visual cues to drivers (innovation, technologies, training eg I-RAP)
 - Investigate adequate physical separation of cyclists where speed limits are higher than 40km/hr.
