2. Acceptance of Minutes of July meetings

The minutes from the July meeting was adopted, noting that Cr Richard Stockman was also an apology.

3. Presentation: Dr Elliot Fishman. EV Charging- policy considerations for Local Government

Dr Fishman provided a comprehensive overview of Electric Vehicle charging, and issues which local government may need to consider as more drivers purchase EVs.

He noted that EV's will not solve all problems associated with transport emissions, but are an important part of the overall approach required. EVs are part of a four-prong approach to reduce transport emissions which includes: improving fuel efficiency, mode shift, reduction in vehicle kilometre travel, and the avoidance of trips.

Dr Fishman noted the National Electric Vehicle Strategy, and compared EV policies in different states, noting that Victoria's EV tax seems to have had little (if any) impact on the change to EVs.

He noted that 90% of all EV charging is likely to occur overnight at the owner's home, but additional charging facilities will be required as the range of vehicles continues to expand (currently 350-4000km on a single charge for some vehicles).

Dr Fishman discussed various types of facilities that suit different contexts – private, public streets, service station equivalents – noting that the time taken to charge EVs is likely to dramatically alter what service stations look like, and where they are located.

Dr Fishman also spoke about the economics of EV charging points, noting that if free charging points are provided this acts as a deterrent to the private sector to introduce infrastructure – and so is not recommended. He noted that the private sector is likely to be interested in installing on-street EV charging points at no cost to councils.

Dr Fishman responded to questions, and noted that he had assisted the NSW government develop technical guidance information on charging solutions, which included such recommendations as: only install charging points on one side of a street; assess genuineness of need for on-street use (ie is off-street available for property); don't put in bike lanes; and don't install on streets with speed limits in excess of 40kph.

He also recommended that any costs for public charging should be higher than at home charging. He recommended that a fact sheet could be developed to assist businesses installing EV charging.

4. Strategic Transport Advocacy

4.1 Ambassador Roles

Access: Cr McNeill advised that she has identified the PTV Access Transport committee as a potential partner, and identified that the committee Chair is Liz Ellis. Cr McNeill also noted the in -round light up tactiles on Swanston St and asked if there was any information about policy and costs for the installation of these devices. It was noted that a similar feature also exists in Chapel St near the Stonnington Town Hall.

Cycling: Cr Thomas has contacted Bicycle Network and their CEO Allison McCormack. She has also identified the Amy Gillett Foundation as a possible partner. Cr Thomas would like to

make contact with BUGs and asked members to let her know of contact details for their local BUGs.

4.2 – Strategic Advocacy

Mr Day outlines the planned Bus Appreciation Week event, and requested members send him expressions of interest for participation. Options include:

- Mayors and MPs on buses which could be combined with social media promotion of issues
- A Try the Bus day (similar to Ride to Work Day)
- And conducting a "Yes to Better Buses Survey"

These events would be arranged to suit each participating council's resources and advocacy objectives. Councils may nominate one or several activities as suits their objectives. Please contact Mr Day if your council wishes to be involved.

Mr Augustus Brown – Hobsons Bay

- Provided a Focus on cycling
- New cycle bridge between Altona and Williamstown
- Integrated Transport Plan
- Better places program continues 2 suburbs at a time
 - Aim to emphasise local function of streets to make pleasant street environment
 - Maher Road cycling path will increase connectivity for cyclists

- Williamstown safety program
 - Includes painted buffered bike lanes
- Mason Street
 - Includes painted buffer bike lanes
 - Roundabouts with bicycle bypasses
- o Contra flow cycling on low speed and low traffic streets
- Also working on planned Better Places looking for funding as part of future LXRP
- Street safety projects also focussing on cyclist safety.
- LXRP Maddox/Champion crossings significant changes to road network in current design may induce traffic into some local streets
- Advocacy
 - o Blackshaws road multi modal design being proposed.
 - o Kororoit Ck Road also multi modal design.
- E Bike fleet (Beam) of 200 bikes has been well received by community after initial high interest.
