2. Executive Elections for 2024

3. Acceptance of Minutes of December 2023 meeting

The minutes from the 6 December 2023 meeting were adopted.

4. Presentation: Mr David Mepham – Rethinking Parking

Mr Mepham spoke about his research and experiences in rethinking parking in the Australian context. David has looked at many approaches taken by councils across Australia, including Melbourne, and noted that results varied considerably. He noted that many stakeholders have deeply entrenched views, and consider parking to be an entitlement. He talked about the need to move from ideas to outcomes, and that this meant you could be described as crazy or courageous!

David talked about the 5 perspectives to consider when you unpack parking issues:

- Place If we gave drivers all the parking they wanted, the destination would not be worth visiting.
- Politics Parking is intensely territorial, emotional, and prone to populism, and this is a barrier to strategic and sustainable parking reform.
- Policy Parking tends to be focused on the 'me, here and now' needs of the driver at the expense of bigger picture and longer term policy objectives.
- Price Subsidised parking exists behind opaque pricing mechanisms. In contrast, a transparent accounting of costs is a vehicle for strategic parking reform.
- Professional practice Parking is a significant land-use issue, located at the juncture
 of transport and urban planning and design. Improving urban parking outcomes
 requires an integrated and collaborative planning process.

David encouraged people to look 50 years into the future to move from personal wants to the big picture of the places we wish to live in.

Questions from members drew out the value of developing and using a dashboard to demonstrate the true cost of parking; the benefit of putting a \$ value on benefits of assets such as open space and footpaths; the costs that parking adds in the affordable housing discussion; and how important accessibility is especially when public transport does not provide access.

5. Strategic Transport Advocacy

5.1 Ambassador Roles

No Ambassador reports were provided this month.

5.2 – Strategic Advocacy

The group discussed the existing Strategic Plan, and where the focus could be for 2024. It was agreed that buses, and accessibility on public transport remained important topics. This information will be used by the executive to plan the year's events.

6. Council Information Sharing

Yarra

Mr Mallis informed the group of Yarra's "New Deal" Cycling plan that aims to improve the safety, connectivity, and accessibility on Yarra's street and path network for people on bikes over the next ten years. Yara is also updating its Active Transport projects, and working on the tram stop upgrades along Gertrude Street (Route 86). Cr Wade also noted that Yarra actively celebrates its projects and that this was well received by the community.

Bayside

Mr Phinief spoke about Bayside's Integrated Transport Strategy, the Suburban Rail Link infrastructure projects, cycling and pedestrian infrastructure projects, the implementation of lower speed limits around some schools; and EV charging.

Reports from Banyule and Boroondara were deferred to March.

- The Local Streets Program which provides \$2m per council continues aiming to build capability and capacity in councils.

- MAV and Vic Health are planning two walking and cycling webinars: Councillors in March; officers in April
- MAV is also running a forum on EV charging issues
- Noted that applications for Heart Foundation grants of up to \$50k will close on 1
 March
- A workshop is being planned with VicRoads on the topic of construction vehicles and community safety.
